insight to state and federal health care issues, and participating in legislative visits allows attendees to speak up on behalf of their hospitals.

Governor Walker Signs Assembly Bills 658 and 366 into Law at Aspirus Wausau Hospital

Governor Scott Walker signed Assembly Bill 658 and Assembly Bill 366 into law March 17 at Aspirus Wausau Hospital as part of his Heroin, Opiate Prevention and Education (H.O.P.E.) tour. During the H.O.P.E. tour, Governor Walker discussed the impact this legislation will have on Wisconsinites who struggle with opiate abuse and addiction.

"Wisconsin, like many other states across the country, is noticing a dangerous trend – an escalating number of cases involving heroin and opiate use, addiction and overdose," Governor Walker said. "The legislation we're signing into law today as a part of our H.O.P.E. tour works to combat this trend by putting in place consistent guidelines and closely monitoring pain management clinics in Wisconsin."

Aspirus and community leaders were on hand to support Gov. Walker and Rep. John Nygren, author of the bills. A former Wausau resident, Rep. Nygren said he was happy to be back at the hospital in which one of his daughters was born.

Aspirus CEO, Matt Heywood, said that prescription drug abuse is a problem that plagues cities throughout Wisconsin, including the rural communities Aspirus serves.

"The strength of this legislation lies in its collaborative approach to a devastating social issue," Heywood said. "As a health care system, we see the effects of heroin and prescription drug abuse, but it will take a team of partners to address the problem."

In 2013, more Wisconsinites died as a result of drug overdose than from motor vehicle crashes, suicide, breast cancer, colon cancer, firearms, influenza, or HIV, according to a report released in September of 2015 by the Department of Health Services (DHS). Drug overdose deaths in Wisconsin doubled from 2004 to 2013 and opioid pain relievers such as oxycodone, hydrocodone and methadone contributed to 45 percent of the 843 drug overdose deaths in 2013, while heroin contributed to about 27 percent.



Assembly Bill 658 – criminalizes the use, possession, manufacture, distribution, and advertisement of any substance or device intended to defraud, circumvent, interfere with, or provide a substitute for a bodily fluid in conjunction with a lawfully administered drug test.

Assembly Bill 366 – with the new discovery of so-called "pill mills" that prescribe highly addictive pain killers without demonstrable patient need, this legislation aims to prevent their spread into Wisconsin. The bill also creates a state pain clinic registry by requiring legitimate pain clinics to be certified by the DHS in order to operate. This will put additional safeguards in place that protect against prescription drug abuse while ensuring legitimate clinics are able to continue to serve patients in need.

Volunteer Reminders

The Joint Commission, an independent, not-for-profit organization dedicated to improving the safety and quality of health care through standards development, accreditation, and certification, requires hospitals to conduct individual performance evaluations of their volunteers every three years. Aspirus volunteer evaluations will take place later this year. Stay tuned for more information.





Pre-School Hands

Since 1997, a dedicated group of Aspirus volunteers have been going out into the school system to educate children on the importance of hand washing. Volunteers provide information to children in their classrooms about germs and how they are spread, and about the purpose, and correct method of hand washing. This year, 48 classes with 876 four- and five-year-olds have been educated on proper hand washing.



Fundraising

➤ The Festival of Trees was held November 23 - 29 and raised \$168,000 to support hospice care and the Aspirus Hospice House.

The Volunteers linen sale held December 1 and 2 raised
\$5,000. Proceeds will be used to fund various Volunteers
projects including Rainbows End Day Camp, Medical Explorers,
and high school scholarships.

➢ In February, the Red Event was supported by sponsors, donors, and volunteers who helped raise \$44,000 to assist patients and bring awareness to heart research and education.



Aspirus Lifeline – System Collaboration

Aspirus Lifeline programs in Antigo, Ironwood, Wausau and Wisconsin Rapids recently united as one system Aspirus Lifeline program. The uniting of these programs has already yielded efficiencies, including saving Aspirus Grand View \$26,000 in monitoring fees. The change also allowed Aspirus Grand View to donate 36 Lifeline units to Aspirus Wausau Hospital and 20 to Aspirus Riverview, saving each location from having to acquire new units at a cost of \$600+ each.

Staff involved with the Lifeline program at all locations can now more easily share trends, discuss volunteer usage, Aspirus social media, community, and other marketing opportunities while collaborating with senior health services. Additionally, the group can now negotiate one master agreement with Philips Lifeline to ensure the best pricing for equipment and monitoring fees. The system Lifeline program offers safety and peace of mind to nearly 1,800 subscribers throughout the Aspirus service area.

Medical Explorers



Medical Explorers is a career exploration program designed for area high school students interested in the medical field. It is held in partnership with the Boy Scouts' "Learning for Life" program. This year, 21 students participated in the four-month program. The group met every other Monday at Aspirus Wausau Hospital to learn about the many medical career opportunities available. Students listened to speakers and toured various areas of the hospital including Information Technology, Heart Institute, Emergency Department, Surgical Services, and Radiation Oncology. Students also toured the Medical College of Wisconsin. The program ended March 14th with an optional CPR certification class.
