## TREASURER'S REPORT

### Financial Report, December 31, 2021

In the second quarter of this fiscal year, we raised \$7,062 after expenses; \$3,890 from Lights of Love, \$2,326 from the raffle, \$500 from the Candy Bar Sale and \$349 from the Nutman Sales. This makes net fundraising for the six months \$16,427, more than the budgeted amount of \$15,475 for the year. Our fundraising has exceeded our expectations.

Although Gift Shop sales are below what they had been in prior years, sales are meeting our expectations given the reduced traffic in the hospital. We budgeted sales to be \$31,175 for the year and after six months, sales are \$16,265.

We funded the purchase of two community transport chairs for the hospital for \$6,262.62. These chairs will be lent to nursing home patients who don't have one and will be returned once the patient has been safely and comfortably transferred from the hospital to the nursing home.

We had \$32,052 in cash at the end of December. We have enough to cover the three \$1,000 scholarships that we will award in the spring, as well as the funds to meet any unplanned needs of Ripon Community Hospital.

We expected a drop in membership due to COVID-19 and budgeted for 50 members. Currently, we have 43 MIGHTY members who continue to raise funds to support RCH and the communities it serves.

## WHAT'S NEW AT SSM HEALTH RIPON COMMUNITY HOSPITAL

We have a lot going on at SSM Health Ripon Community Hospital these days - all exciting developments to help us continue our efforts to grow and offer as many services as possible at a local level. I'm proud to share with you but a few of these key advancements.

### COVID-19 Update

After nearly two years of adjusting life in light of the COVID-19 pandemic, there are some bright lights at the end of this long tunnel. As COVID-19 positive cases continue to decrease, Ripon Community Hospital recently updated its visitor guidelines to allow one visitor per day per stay and is seeing fewer hospitalized patients and incoming emergency department patients with positive COVID-19 results.

### New Podiatrist

Molly Meier, DPM, podiatrist (foot & ankle) is now serving patients full time in Ripon. Dr. Meier has previously served in Berlin and Green Lake. She specializes in diabetic foot care and wound care.

She earned her medical degree at the Dr. William M. Scholl College of Podiatric Medicine and completed her residency at the Jackson North Medical Group North Miami Beach in Florida, and the Presence Health Saints Mary and Elizabeth Medical Center in Chicago.

Dr. Meier is certified by the American Board of Neurophysiologic Monitoring, American Board of Foot and Ankle Surgery, American Board of Podiatric Medicine, and American Board of Wound Management.

### General Surgery Coverage

Joanne Pasiuk, MD, general surgeon, is now providing general surgery call coverage at Ripon Community Hospital with Drs. Karl Bertram and Karen Reynolds. This addition helps to ensure that surgical coverage is available to patients at any given time.

Dr. Pasiuk offers a full range of surgical services, including advanced laparoscopic procedures, varicose veins, and colonoscopies. She also currently serves as the SSM Health Greater Fond du Lac Region medical director, Ambulatory Care/Medical Informatics.

### Frontline Worker Protection

SSM Health is formally registered in support of Wisconsin AB 960 legislation, which is designed to align criminal penalties for battery and threats of violence against health care workers with battery and threats of violence committed against other critical public safety personnel like law enforcement officers, officers of the court, and certain state employees.

The new bill would make battery or threats against health care workers or their family members a class H felony when done in response to actions taken by the workers or situations at health care facilities. Violators could face three years in prison plus three years of extended supervision, up to a \$10,000 fine, or both.

SSM Health leaders have been actively sharing their insights both within the state and nation legislators to raise awareness and appeal for such legislation.

### New SSM Health Region President

Following a national search, SSM Health is pleased to announce that Sue Anderson has been named Regional President of SSM Health Wisconsin, effective March 1, 2022.

Most recently, Anderson served as Executive Vice President for Virginia Mason Health System and President of Virginia Mason Medical Center in Seattle. Prior to that, she served as Chief Financial Officer and Chief Information Officer for the health system.

## Jeanne Lyke Honor

Jeanne Lyke, a Ripon pediatrician, will receive Ripon College's 2022 Founders' Day Award at the College's Commencement ceremony May 15. The award is presented annually to an individual or organization in Ripon and surrounding communities who exemplifies the ideals behind the creation of Ripon College. The college was officially founded January 29, 1851.

### COVID-19
