Howard Young Therapist Earns Credential as Certified Hand Therapist

Kari Ruhr of Howard Young Medical Center has earned the Certified Hand Therapist designation after completing all required examinations and clinical studies from The Hand Therapy Certification Commission, Inc., the recognized specialist in hand therapy certification worldwide.

These requirements include at least three years of clinical experience as an occupational therapist, a minimum of 4,000 hours in direct practice in hand therapy, and successful completion of advanced clinical skills and theory in upper limb rehabilitation.

Ruhr has been providing therapy services in the Northwood's for the last 6 years as an occupational therapist at Howard Young specializing in hand and upper extremity rehabilitation.

"I take pride in helping my patients get back to work or doing what they enjoy by utilizing a number of traditional techniques including manual therapy or massage and combining them with technology like ultrasound, fluidotherapy and paraffin treatments," said Ruhr.
