Congratulations! We are privileged to notify you that on March 6, 2017, Truven Health Analytics®, IBM Watson Health $^{\text{TM}}$, announced our hospital's selection as a 2017 Truven Health 100 Top Hospitals® award winner .

The notification received states, in part:

This honor is the direct result of all of us working very hard to provide the best service possible. It is a testimony to the high degree of respect and teamwork everyone displays each day.



Community Health Education (CHE)

Each year, Partners of WHA selects one issue to focus attention on. Our CHE focus for 2017 is "DRUGS END DREAMS". This comes in the wake of Wisconsin's recognition that the state's opioid epidemic is a public health crisis. A task force was established by Governor Walker to address the crisis.



Prescription opioids are chemicals that are similar to our own endorphins-opioids that our bodes produce naturally to relieve pain. Opioid medications act on opioid receptors in the spinal cord, gastrointestinal tracts, and brain to reduce the intensity of pain perceptions. Opioid pain relievers are generally safe when taken for a short time and as prescribed by a doctor. However. Since the 1990's they have been increasingly used to treat chronic pain, despite sparse evidence for their effectiveness when used long term.

Importantly, in addition to relieving pain, opioids also activate reward regions in the brain causing euphoria or high—which can increase potential for misuse and addiction. Their chemical makeup is very similar to heroin.

Prescription opioid medications include hydrocodone (Vicodin), oxycodone (OxyContin, Percocet), oxymophone (Opana), morphine (Kadian, Avinza) codeine, fentanyl, and others. Opioids also include the ILLEGAL drug heroin.
