#### Ascension to Hold Free Diabetes Screening and Prevention Events in June

Ascension Hospitals and Clinics in the Northwood's are joining together during the first week of June to host free diabetes prevention and screening events in Tomahawk, Woodruff, Eagle River and Rhinelander. The events are part of an effort to help identify the 1 in 3 American adults who have pre-diabetes of which, 90-percent do not know their health might be at risk not addressed.

"The good news is there are things you can do to avoid complications and even prevent type 2 diabetes," said Hope Williams, RDN, CDE, CLS, Coordinator of Community Health Improvement for Ascension Wisconsin. "Having diabetes puts you at a higher risk for developing other health problems. However, if you understand the risks, you can take steps now to lower your chance of diabetes related complications."

Each event will feature an opportunity to meet clinical experts and receive free health screenings including Blood Glucose, Blood Pressure and Body Mass Index. Information and interactive exhibits on selfcare behaviors like healthy eating and problem solving for issues like low blood sugar will also be available.

There is no charge to attend and light refreshments will be served along with the opportunity for participants to win door prizes.

#### Ascension Eagle River Volunteers Spearhead Efforts to Purchase New Ambulance

When an ambulance call comes in, response speed is critical. That's how lives are saved. And in an area like Eagle River, ambulances also need to cover a lot of ground.

Ascension Eagle River Hospital has two ambulances and a high-quality, welltrained 24/7 paramedic service covering Eagle River and the surrounding townships.

They also provide paramedic intercepts to the towns of Land O' Lakes, Conover, Phelps, St. Germain and Three Lakes. The two ambulances together run about 15,000 miles per year, and in 2017 responded to roughly 900 emergency calls.

When the time came to replace the older Ambulance and to purchase two Stryker Power-LOAD System cots, the Auxiliary Partners of Ascension Eagle River Hospital stepped up through their donations to the Howard Young Foundation.

"The Auxiliary Partners exist to support Ascension Eagle River Hospital and surrounding communities," said Kathy Viergutz, Community Service Coordinator. "Helping with the purchase of the ambulance and cots is a perfect fit for their mission."

They also recognized that auto lift cots would provide an added level of safety for EMS teams and provide a safer experience for patients. "The cots make a huge difference for our EMS staff," Viergutz said. "It takes a huge toll on a person's back to manually lift and move patients."

In April 2017, the Auxiliary Partners membership voted and approved paying for the purchases with funds they had raised through their thrift store and Life Direct home alert program and donated to the Foundation's Eagle River's Greatest Need fund. Because that fund is part of the Foundation's Journey to Excellence Campaign, Ascension agreed to match the \$125,000 donation.

After the new ambulance arrived in December 2017, it was sent out for exterior detailing. The Eagle River based ambulance is the first in Wisconsin to carry the Ascension brand. In addition to the hospital logo and other standard decals, a graphic also recognizes the Auxiliary Partners of Ascension Eagle River for their donation.

The new ambulance was put into service in April 2018. But that doesn't mean the old one was put out to pasture or sold for scrap. It was donated to the Town of Russell First Responders in Lincoln County to fill their need for an ambulance to help re-energize their program.
