What's New at SSM Health Ripon Community Hospital

An update from DeAnn Thurmer, President, SSM Health Ripon Community Hospital and SSM Health Waupun Memorial Hospital, and Nicole Gill, Vice President Patient Care Services & CNO, SSM Health Ripon Community Hospital and SSM Health Waupun Memorial Hospital

We have a lot going on at SSM Health Ripon Community Hospital these days - all exciting developments to help us continue our efforts to grow and offer as many services as possible at a local level. I'm proud to share with you but a few of these key advancements.

Day Stabilization Services Updates

Since starting its Day Stabilization Services in early 2023, SSM Health Ripon Community Hospital has remained nimble and flexible as mental health needs within its service area continue to change.

Outpatient Day Stabilization Services is available to help individuals experiencing any of these common non-emergent concerns: depression, mood disturbances, anxiety, stress, grief reactions, psychosis, distortion, or disconnection from reality, and more.

As part of this ongoing evaluation, the hospital has moved to a walk-in model where individuals can come to the hospital emergency department or work through a professional referral source to access these services during day-time hours, seven days a week. Care will also be offered on a one-on-one basis, moving from previous group-based opportunities.

The hours of operation are now Monday through Friday from 7:30 am - 7 pm, and Saturday and Sunday from 8 am - 5 pm. Questions or inquiries can be directed to 920-745-3850.

Day Stabilization Services is also being complemented by new free SSM Health virtual behavioral health services to offer an additional option for individuals experiencing a variety of mental health challenges.

To also reflect these changes, Day Stabilization Services will now be referenced as the Behavioral Health Walk-in Clinic.

WHA CEO Panel

DeAnn Thurmer participated in a CEO panel discussion at the recent Partners of WHA convention in Stevens Point. The panel discussion focused on pressing health care topics, including volunteer and employee retention and recruitment, COVID-19 pandemic financial concerns, medical professional licensing, hospital mergers, COVID-19 projections, and more.

New Meeting Room Technology

The Green Lake Room now features all new technology to help with virtual meeting opportunities and internal presentation capabilities. The upgrades feature a new podium with a laptop. In addition, an HDMI cable and adapters are available for users to use their own laptop. Two new cameras for viewing both rooms. A new touch screen controls all functions, and two new speakers offer great audio experiences.

Produce Sharing

Since its opening on Parkside Street, the team at SSM Health Ripon Community Hospital has planted and harvested apples for all to enjoy. This year was no exception as Nicole Gill, vice president of patient care/chief nursing officer, took time to pick and distribute apples to staff and volunteers serving the entire hospital that particular day! What a great way to take a moment and interact with staff and share our bounty!

TREASURER'S UPDATE

Financial Report - September 30, 2023

The financial report on September 30, 2023, is for the first three months of our fiscal year. Our fund-raising efforts these first three months were very successful. Net proceeds from the Mum Sale were \$2,004, the Candy Bar Sale will net \$1,080 when all candy bars are sold, and we received \$350 from store roundups.

Gift shop sales were 29% higher than last year at this time.

We donated \$6,128 for the purchase of a sit-to-stand device for Ripon Community Hospital. Donations received for the Lights of Love fund-raiser have been earmarked for this and we used other fundraising money to make up the difference.

We had \$41,143.23 in cash at the end of September. So, we have the funds to support the needs of Ripon Community Hospital as they are identified and provide scholarships in the spring.

5 Things You Should Know about COVID-19 Vaccines

1. Updated 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccines save lives and prevent hospitalizations.

In the first 10 months that COVID-19 vaccines were available, they saved over 200,000 lives and prevented over 1.5 million hospitalizations in the United States. This is the purpose of these vaccines: to save lives and prevent severe disease. They can also reduce the risk of Long COVID. Getting vaccinated builds protection against COVID-19, protecting people from the potentially serious consequences of getting the disease, including hospitalization and death.

2. COVID-19 vaccines are effective.

We have multiple years of experience showing the effectiveness of COVID-19 vaccines. However, the strains of virus causing most of the disease change and immunity wanes over time. The changes from last year's vaccines are small, but they help make the vaccine better at targeting the virus strains circulating now and give your immune system a boost. Based on three years of experience with these vaccines, we can expect the vaccines to increase protection and save lives.

3. When side effects from COVID-19 vaccines occur, they are usually mild or moderate.

COVID-19 vaccines have undergone - and continue to undergo - the most intense vaccine safety monitoring in U.S. history. It is important to look at the whole picture in the context of the benefit-risk balance, and the evidence strongly supports that the benefits of COVID-19 vaccines outweigh the risks.

4. Talk to your health care provider before you believe everything you see or hear from hers.

A single scientific finding is not conclusive and can be used out of context, or there may be other inaccurate information circulating about COVID-19 vaccines. If you have questions or concerns about the COVID-19 vaccine, talk to your health care provider.

5. The updated COVID-19 vaccine recommendations are based on data and science.

The available evidence includes extensive safety and effectiveness data on the original and bivalent COVID-19 vaccines and data on the updated vaccines from the three manufacturers, including clinical trial data from Moderna and preclinical data from Novavax and Pfizer.

Bottom line: CDC recommends everyone six months and older get an updated COVID-19 vaccine to protect against potentially serious COVID-19 outcomes this fall and winter. This is especially important for older adults and people with weakened immune systems, who are at highest risk for severe illness.
